**Why Hope for Haiti?**

# **Broomball Rules & Regulations**

## **Object of the Game**

The object of Broomball is for one team to win the game by scoring more goals than their opposition. Teams do this by moving the ball up-field as a team until they are in a position to shoot for a goal. Teams, whilst attacking the opposition goal must also be prepared to defend their goal quickly if they lose possession of the ball. Like ice hockey, Broomball is an extremely physical game that can get extremely rough at times.

## **Players**

Each team has six players comprised of: 1 goalkeeper, 2 defenders, 3 attackers

## **Winning the Game**

At the end of the game the team with the most goals is declared the winner. If at the end of regulation the game is tied then 3 players will do a run-up penalty shootout. If still tied then the shootout will continue until a winner is determined.

## **Rules of Broomball**

- Games will be two 10-minute halves with a 3 minute halftime for each game. Paper, Rock, Scissors will determine which team begins with the ball and which half defends. At halftime teams will switch halves and who starts with the ball.
- Once the game begins each team will simultaneously attempt to score a goal in the opposition's net whilst at the same time preventing the opposition from scoring in theirs. Substitutions will be allowed to happen freely during the course of play as long as 6 players are on the rink per team.
- A face-off shall occur after each goal.
- Players can pass the ball between themselves using their stick or boots (Fouls will be called for passing with your hands).
- Goals can only be scored if the ball has been hit by the stick or inadvertently rebounds off another player. A goal will not be awarded if the ball is purposely kicked or thrown into the goal.
- Penalties will be given if a broom is swung above waist height. If the ball goes above the waist we encourage you to use your hands to knock it down. A restart will begin where the foul takes place with 3 ft of space given.
- Games are monitored by two referees who are on the ice during the game and have the same powers to award goals, call penalties and fouls etc.
- Players are allowed to use their stick to try and take the ball from opposition players.
- One female and one male need to be on the ice per team at all times. Open to all 11 yrs old and up.
- Brooms and balls will be provided for each team to play.
- Special broomball shoes are not allowed as they give an unfair advantage for the individual.
- Additional rules may be added per referee necessity, but will be communicated before the tournament.
- Proceeds go to charity so play with good attitudes and make this fun for everyone.
